Dear Brothers and Sisters.

With the spread of the virus in Sydney various restrictions came into place last weekend for all of NSW. We can be thankful that we are not in lockdown like Sydney. However, it does mean no singing in the Church, a return to the 4m2 rule, as well as the wearing of face masks in all indoor areas of public buildings including churches. It is anticipated at the time of printing that these measures will be in force until to 9th of July. Let's hope and pray that this is the case, not because they are a minor inconvenience to ourselves, but rather, because if they are extended it is because more people have become sick as a result of the virus. Please continue to hold all people around the world affected by Covid-19 in your prayers.

As many of you are aware the Bishop was due to be here for the Vigil Mass, to install me as Parish Priest. However the Bishop is unwell, and he has asked the Vicar General to step in. We welcome Fr Andrew Doohan back among us and I ask that we pray for a speedy recovery for the Bishop.

On Tuesday of this past week, (the 29th of June), the Church celebrated an important anniversary. His Holiness Pope emeritus, Benedict 16, marked 70 years of priestly ordination. As someone who is in my (very) early 40's, I am amazed that anybody has been doing anything for 70 years! I ask all who see this to pray for the Pope emeritus as he marks this milestone.

On Saturday the 31st of July following the 9.30am Mass, there will be formation sessions for those who wish to continue as readers at Mass, as well as those who wish to commence this ministry. As I said last week the enthusiasm of those involved in this ministry has been inspiring to me. I hope to see this ministry grow in the Parish.

Last week I reiterated my request for suggestions to be placed before the Parish Pastoral Council to help formulate a Pastoral Plan. The only response I received, was around the social aspect of Parish life. So I thought great, let's try something and see what happens. I note that there is to be a Race Meeting at the Tuncurry racetrack on Friday the 10th September. If anybody from the Parish is interested in going along please contact the office to register interest. This will be a good way for people to spend time with each other and build relationships. Likewise, if people have any ideas about how to encourage building the social aspect of our Parish life, feel free to make contact and leave any suggestions. I look forward to receiving more than 2 suggestions for the pastoral plan!

Donations for the solar panel project are continuing to come in. Thank you for the generosity that people have shown in meeting this project. Please remember that all donations for this project and for the renovation of the roof are indeed most welcome. Thank you all for your continued support for the Parish.

As I continue to settle in I look forward to meeting more of you.

Changes to Mass Registrations

The recent changes to Covid-19 regulations have impacted churches across NSW and have forced us to review our Mass registration process. We are currently restricted by the 4m2 distancing rule which allows us to have a maximum of 68 people in the church for each Mass, not including those that are assisting in the Mass e.g readers, sacristans and ushers.

Regardless of which way we chose to go about it, we had to have everyone re-register for each Mass as we had over 68 people already booked in for each Mass. We have decided to trial an online booking system for Mass registrations through our parish website. If you don't have access to a computer, internet or are unable to book online for any reason you can contact the parish office and we will do this for you. Those who don't have email addresses have been contacted and will be assisted.

Bookings will need to be made weekly during this period of heavy restrictions to ensure everyone gets an opportunity to book for the Mass they want to attend. Mass registrations remain closed until the Monday before the weekend Mass and close at 3.00pm the Friday before the weekend Mass.

We apologise if you are unable to attend the Mass you regularly attend due it being booked out, but you are welcome to book in for another Mass time. Fr Peter has reinstated the Sun 5.30pm Mass during this period so there are now 5 Mass times to choose from. The 5.30pm Mass will remain in place for next weekend 11//7/21 and will be reviewed for the following weekends depending on the restrictions.

If you book for Mass but something comes up that prevents you from attending, you can cancel your booking. The instructions to cancel your booking are included in your booking confirmation email from Trybooking. If you decide to swap to a different Mass time you must cancel your current booking before booking in for a different Mass time. If you are part of the Mass e.g. reader, sacristan or usher, you do not need to register as you will already be added to the list. All previous Mass registrations have been cancelled; this includes re-occurring, alternating and one-off bookings.

The current process for booking in for Mass at the Holy Name Church is as follows:

5. Fill out your booking details and click "Purchase" (please note, there is no cost involved for booking in for Mass)

6. An email will be sent to your email address confirming your booking. If you don't receive this email your booking hasn't been processed and you will need to book again.

If you need assistance with your booking, please don't hesitate to contact the parish office on 6554 6401. I would be more than happy to give you a hand and walk you through the process or book in for you. If you know of others who might struggle with an online booking system, please reach out and give them a hand or direct them to the parish office.

Covid-19 regulations are constantly changing so we need to be adaptable as well. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we move over to an online booking system. If you have any questions or concerns please let me know.
